- Health-Centered Dentistry: Treatment Planning and Case Acceptance. Learn definition of health centered dentistry; how
 to help patients choose long-term dental solutions instead of quick fixes; how to implement simple techniques for increased case
 acceptance.
- **Temporomandibular Joint Disorders: Diagnosis and Therapy.** Through the use of case studies (using MRIs and ICATs of the TMJ's), discover how to gain an accurate diagnosis, therapy and long-term prognosis for TMD patients.
